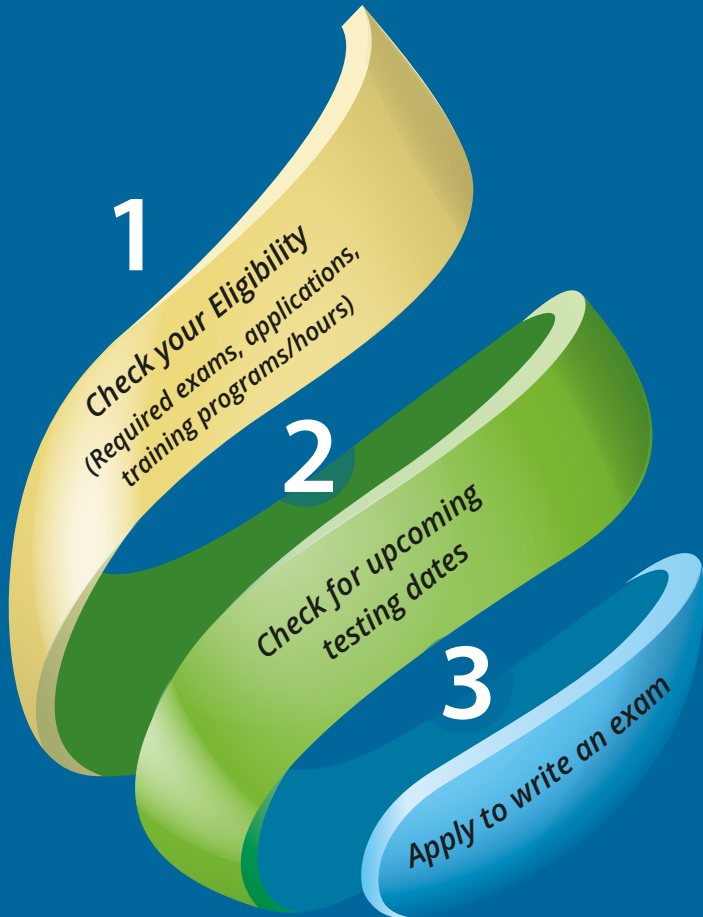


HOW TO BECOME A SMALL SYSTEM OPERATOR

CERTIFICATION TYPES

Bulk Water Delivery (BWD)

- Completion of 12 hours (1.2 Continuing Education Units (CEUs))
- Minimum of 50 hours hands-on operating experience, over a period of six months or longer

Once you become a certified operator you are required to maintain your certification by:

- Maintaining annual EOCP membership dues

Small System Certifications serve a maximum population of 500 people and have two types

Small Water System (SWS)

- Completion of 12 hours (1.2 Continuing Education Units (CEUs)) in an approved operator training course
- Minimum of 50 hours hands-on operating experience, over a period of six months or longer

Once you become a certified operator you are required to maintain your certification by:

- Completing 1.2 approved CEUs every two years
- Maintaining annual EOCP membership dues

Small Wastewater Certification (SWWS)

- Completion of 12 hours (1.2 Continuing Education Units (CEUs)) in an approved operator training course
- Minimum of 50 hours hands-on operating experience, over a period of six months or longer

Once you become a certified operator you are required to maintain your certification by:

- Completing 1.2 approved CEUs every two years
- Maintaining annual EOCP membership dues
